- B. Programs/Project Updates
  - 1. Public Art
    - a. Amusing Breeze

Artist Chris Duh is exploring costs for a potential sustainable solution for the mosaic ball portion of the piece. It will likely be a stainless-steel solution through a company who produces specialty metals.

The piece has been repaired and will be delivered this week.

## c. Kuros

This piece has been restored, delivered and is ready to install at the new Justice Center when they are ready for it. Parks crew plans to create a pedestal for the piece.

The two engagement activities were successful.

## e. Windswept

The group discussed the idea of a rededication in conjunction with the grand opening of the Justice Center. The piece will be located near the front entrance.

Immediately following the abbreviated August 20 LAC meeting the art tour will take place.

Plans for the public art joint work sessions with the LAC and Governing Body to formulate guidelines, finetune the process and establish a two to four-year master plan for public art continues.

## 2. Outdoor Concert Series

Recent concerts were very successful. The bands were great and patrons continue to tell us they like the variety of styles of music offered. The last spring concert was held June 16. Fall concerts will resume on September 15 and September 22.

## 3. Community Orchestra

The Meet & Greet was held on May 23 and went well. Orchestra t-shirts were handed out to the musicians at the event. The first concert is scheduled for June 29.

The licensing agreement has been confirmed. Performers from 2023 were contacted to see their interest in this year's performance.

About 70 people attended the reception for Carol Tinklepaugh, Willa Raybould and Rick Schaff. The next show will feature Lori Stanziola, printmaking and a collection from Judy Tuckness. Applications are currently being accepted for the 33<sup>rd</sup> annual Lenexa Artists Show, which will be installed on August 12.

Positive feedback continues regarding the exhibit and the location at Black Hoof

Park. The Peace Pole Stroll and Awards Ceremony will take place on July 18.
